



PRIORITY WASTE LIMITED ZERO-TO-LANDFILL POLICY

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1. Policy Statement

Priority Waste Limited is committed to operating a Zero-to-Landfill approach across all waste streams handled by the business. This applies to:

- Waste collected on behalf of customers (including hazardous and non-hazardous waste)
- Waste generated internally through company operations

Our objective is to ensure that no waste handled by Priority Waste Limited is disposed of via landfill, unless legally or technically unavoidable.

2. Scope

This policy applies to:

- All employees, contractors, and partners
- All waste streams collected, transported, and managed by Priority Waste Limited
- All internal waste generated from offices, operations, and logistics

This includes (but is not limited to):

- Hazardous waste (e.g. chemicals, paints, oils, batteries)
 - WEEE (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment)
 - General waste
 - Recycling streams
 - Packaging waste
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3. Definition of Zero-to-Landfill

Zero-to-Landfill means that waste is diverted from landfill through alternative treatment routes, including:

- Recycling
- Reuse
- Recovery (including energy-from-waste)
- Specialist treatment for hazardous waste

Landfill disposal is considered a last resort and will only be used where:

- No viable alternative treatment route exists
- It is required for safety, compliance, or environmental protection

4. Our Commitments

Priority Waste Limited will:

4.1 Waste Hierarchy Compliance

Operate in accordance with the waste hierarchy:

1. Prevention
2. Reuse
3. Recycling
4. Recovery
5. Disposal (last resort only)

4.2 Approved Treatment Routes

Ensure all waste is directed to approved, licensed facilities that prioritise:

- Recycling and material recovery
- Treatment processes that minimise environmental impact
- Energy recovery where recycling is not possible

4.3 Hazardous Waste Management

Ensure hazardous waste is:

- Classified, packaged, and transported in full compliance with legislation
 - Sent to specialist treatment facilities
 - Diverted from landfill wherever technically possible
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4.4 Supplier and Partner Management

Work only with vetted and compliant disposal partners who:

- Demonstrate strong environmental performance
 - Support landfill diversion
 - Maintain all relevant permits and certifications
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4.5 Internal Waste Reduction

Minimise waste generated by our own operations through:

- Recycling initiatives across offices and depots
 - Reduction of single-use materials
 - Responsible procurement practices
 - Digital-first processes to reduce paper waste
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4.6 Continuous Improvement

Regularly review waste streams and processes to:

- Increase recycling and recovery rates
 - Identify new treatment technologies
 - Improve overall environmental performance
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5. Compliance and Legislation

Priority Waste Limited will comply with all relevant UK environmental legislation, including:

- Environmental Protection Act 1990
- Hazardous Waste Regulations
- Duty of Care requirements
- Waste (England and Wales) Regulations

All waste will be managed in accordance with legal and regulatory requirements at all times.

6. Monitoring and Reporting

We will:

- Monitor waste treatment routes and landfill diversion rates

- Maintain accurate documentation (e.g. consignment notes, transfer notes)
 - Provide reporting to customers where required
 - Review supplier performance regularly
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7. Responsibility

All employees are responsible for supporting this policy by:

- Following correct waste handling procedures
- Ensuring accurate waste classification and documentation
- Promoting environmentally responsible practices

Management is responsible for:

- Ensuring implementation of this policy
 - Providing training and guidance
 - Monitoring compliance and performance
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8. Policy Review

This policy will be reviewed annually or sooner if:

- Legislation changes
 - Operational practices evolve
 - Improvements are identified
